

What does West Point's Summer Leaders Seminar offer?

The seminar offers a variety of courses from which to choose. Classes are small, and our instructors are very helpful. Do you like the basic sciences, mathematics, or, perhaps, engineering? Do you prefer the humanities, modern languages, or psychology? It's up to you. Whichever you decide, you will get hands-on experiences, including many in the Academy's modern computer and laboratory facilities.

The Summer Leaders Seminar offers a concentrated week of academic, athletic, and social experiences at West Point. Students enjoy the Academy's academic offerings and see West Point's leadership program in action through the cadets who help coordinate the seminar activities. When you arrive on Saturday you begin a week of academic classes, military training, sports, tours, and a boat ride on the Hudson River. You will also take the Candidate Fitness Assessment test, a requirement for admission to West Point. Cadets will escort you, organize recreation activities, and help you in the cadet dormitories.

The cadets you meet are beginning their final year at the U.S. Military Academy. They will answer any questions you have about West Point or the Army. Every West Point cadet likes to talk about the Academy experience. You will be surprised at what you learn.



Students from all over the nation attend the Summer Leaders Seminar, allowing you to be introduced to a completely different college experience. You will obtain a better understanding of the importance of leadership and how you can help yourself and our country.

There are two sessions of the Summer Leaders Seminar scheduled in 2008. The first session begins Saturday, June 7, and ends Friday, June 13. The second session starts Saturday, June 14, and concludes on Friday, June 20.

About 400 students will attend each of the sessions. The cost is \$325, excluding transportation costs to and from West Point. You should apply online at www.admissions.usma.edu no later than March 31. Students are offered admission to the Summer Leaders Seminar on a rolling basis, so you should apply as soon as possible.

Why consider attending the Summer Leaders Seminar?

The Summer Leaders Seminar was established to help all students — not just those considering West Point as a college option. By attending the seminar you gain a better understanding of the academic opportunities at a service academy that thrives on small classes and frequent testing. In a small way you will see the importance of developing leaders at one of the most respected academic institutions in the world.

West Point ranks among the top five in the nation in producing Rhodes scholars and Hertz fellows. Many seniors are also selected for Marshall, Gates Cambridge, Truman, East-West Center and National Science Foundation fellowships and scholarships.
